

Dr. Barclay is an Assistant Professor of Classics in the Department of Modern Languages and Classics at Saint Mary's

University. She holds a Bachelor of Arts in Classics (University of Alberta, 1985), a Masters Degree in Greek and Roman History (Dept. of Classics, University of Toronto, 1991) and a Ph.D. in Greek Art and Archaeology (Art History Department, University of Toronto, 2002). She taught at McMaster and UNB before joining the faculty at SMU in 2006.

Over the course of her studies, she has made several trips to the Mediterranean, the Near and Middle East (Turkey, Egypt and Jordan), including two years in Greece - in 1989/90 as the James Rignall Wheeler Fellow at the American School of Classical Studies in Athens and in 2001/2002 as the Homer Thompson Fellow at the Canadian Institute in Greece. Dr. Barclay's main research interests are in Greek religion, iconography, and in the cultural interactions between the Greeks and their Mediterranean neighbours in the Early Iron Age (9th to 6th centuries BC). Her teaching interests cover a broad range: the Bronze Age through Hellenistic periods of Greece and the Near East, Greek history, social history, art history and archaeology, mythology and religion.
